# 1) MOBILIZE FOR EVERYONE'S PURCHASING POWER

#### **Compensation:**

- **Salary increases** aligned with Group results and inflation.
- A real budget to reduce gender pay gaps.
- Higher work condition bonuses (meal allowance, on-call, team, night shifts, weekends, etc.).
- Increase remote work allowances.

#### Variable Pay:

- Implement a minimum SIP/STIP.
- Eliminate the 100% average rule.
- Raise the STIP floor to 100% for employees rated "Consistent."

#### **Profit-Sharing and Incentives:**

- Align profit-sharing rates with Group results; raise the maximum to 12%.
- WESOP: 30% discount on shares.

#### 2) DEFEND AND GROW EMPLOYMENT

- Protect jobs across all industrial and service activities: R&D, production, logistics, support, services, and sales.
- Take an ambitious approach to supporting the "AMBITION 2030" program.
- Promote the development and renewal of skills to keep pace with changes in our professions (Artificial Intelligence, environmental challenges, etc.).

#### 3) WORKING CONDITIONS

#### **Work Schedule Adjustments:**

- Better support for chosen or therapeutic parttime work and specific situations (disability, incapacity, etc.).
- Improve assistance for special circumstances (single-parent families, caregivers, international employees, etc.).

#### Sustainable Mobility:

- Increase allowances for soft mobility options.
- Contribute to the purchase and installation of charging stations for individual or shared use.

#### 4) PROTECT OUR HEALTH

#### Mental Health:

- Influence decisions to ensure real risk prevention, including recruitment, quality tools, better change management, setting realistic goals, and genuine financial recognition.
- Drive modernization of management practices, fostering a climate of safety and trust at work.

#### **Physical Health:**

• Strengthen safety and workstation ergonomics across all sites.

• Preserve and improve our benefits, particularly through joint committees (insurance, health, savings).

#### 1) STRENGTHEN PURCHASING POWER AND MEET YOUR EVERYDAY NEEDS

#### **Subsidy Rules**

- Reassess subsidy contribution rates, especially the portion for children.
- Relax the rules by creating a "small invoices" allowance for minor purchases eligible for subsidies.
- Unlock the limit of 4 requests per year.
- Include all types of accommodation for itinerant stays.





### **Better Support for Families' Priority Expenses**

- Contribute to public transportation subscriptions for children's trips between home and school.
- Provide extra help for single-parent families or those in vulnerable situations.
- Offer back-to-school financial assistance.

#### **Act on Purchasing Power**

• Offer group purchasing options to provide advantageous collective rates throughout the year.

#### 2) PROMOTE LOCAL ENGAGEMENT, SUSTAINABILITY, AND GIVE YOUNG PEOPLE **A VOICE**

#### Local, Responsible, and Sustainable Consumption

- Offer negotiated prices from local producers to promote responsible, highquality consumption and support our local community.
- Expand the range of responsible and solidarity-based travel options.
- Provide the ability to offset the carbon footprint of our activities.





#### Giving Youth a Bigger Role

- Offer meaningful experiences for young people through eco-friendly and/or solidarity-based leisure and vacation options, themed stays, activities, and events.
- Increase subsidies for tickets and packages for music and theater festivals.
- Provide discounts on subscriptions for theater, cinema, music, and digital entertainment.
